

## Home-School Agreement

Our intention at Cullercoats Primary School is to maximise the development of the personal, physical and intellectual growth of the whole school community within a supportive learning environment.

We believe that children benefit when links between school and home are strong and we invite all parents to enter into a partnership with us.

The school will:

- provide a welcoming, stimulating, attractive, caring and secure environment for the education of the child.
- provide a broad and balanced curriculum.
- provide opportunities for the child to develop a belief in his or her own abilities and personal worth, and give praise for achievement.
- provide equal opportunities for the child to achieve his or her potential.
- provide support for the child if he or she has a particular special need.
- encourage the child to co-operate, appreciate and respect others.
- encourage the child to have a positive attitude to all school activities and the environment.
- set challenging targets for the child.
- provide regular opportunities for communication between parents and school staff.
- set homework appropriate to the child's age and ability.

The Parent/Carer will:

- try to ensure that the child attends school, arrives on time and is prepared for school activities.
- contact the school as soon as possible when the child is absent, or they have a concern about the child.
- ensure that the child attends school in appropriate clothing and footwear as outlined in the School Prospectus.
- support the School Behaviour Policy and discuss this with the child.
- encourage the child to work hard in order to achieve his/her potential, and discuss with him/her the targets which are set.
- participate in opportunities to discuss the child's progress with appropriate school staff.
- encourage the child to complete homework set by the school.

The child will:

- follow directions at once.
- respect other children, adults and their property.
- not hurt anyone with words or actions.
- always be polite.
- try their best at school.
- wear the school uniform.
- do their homework.
