What have we been up to?

This week in nursery we have continued our bird topic. We have enjoyed learning about how birds look after themselves in winter. Today, we have been doing a very messy job and have made bird feeders with the children which we will hang around the school grounds for the birds to enjoy. We have also been looking at migrating birds such as Swallows and Geese and talking to the children about how they move to hotter countries in the winter. The children were particularly keen to look at a world map to track the journey that migrating Swallows and Geese take.

The children have also loved junk modelling this week and we have seen some fabulous creations of bird boxes, bird nests and bird feeders.

In our Phonics sessions, we have continued to learn about rhyming words. We have read many stories and completed rhyming activities to help the children practise this skill. We have also been doing some sound talk to help the children hear the sounds needed to make simple words e.g.

b-e-d, h-a-t, p-i-g

We have also been talking about our feelings - what makes us feel happy and sad. The children have enjoyed singing and dancing to some feel good songs.
