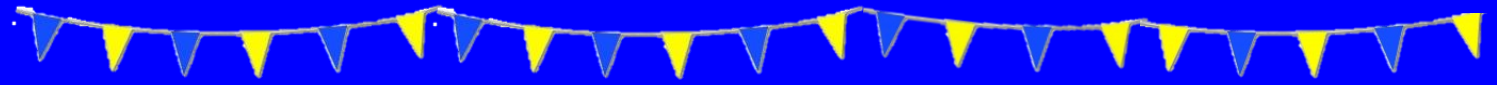

What have we been up to?

This week in nursery we enjoyed learning about 'Sharks'. The children have learnt lots of interesting facts about sharks - did you know some sharks are as big as double decker bus while others are as small as a banana?? The biggest shark is called a 'Whale Shark'? We have also enjoyed reading lots of shark related books such as 'Shark in the Park' and singing and performing the actions to 'baby shark'.

Phonics



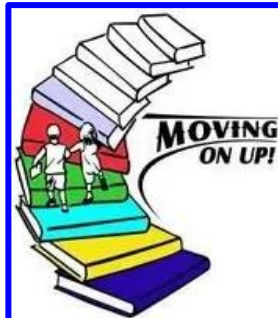
For the children moving up to Reception, we have been so busy in our phonics lessons this week and have continued to blend simple words e.g. c/a/t - cat. As we are getting so clever, we have now moved onto segmenting words - this involves giving the children a word and asking them to break it down into its individual sounds. E.g. dog - d/o/g. Our youngest children have also been very busy singing lots of nursery rhymes and beginning to explore the rhyming words within them.
